# FEMA - Prepare for Peak Hurricane Season

Prepare for peak hurricane season at Ready.gov or Listo.gov (Spanish)

Keep an **emergency disaster kit** at home, the supplies should last you several days, including a flashlight, extra batteries, copies of important documents (stored in waterproof bags), water and non-perishable food

Always have an **evacuation plan** for your family, remembering that there could be utility outages

Maintain current flood insurance and keep virtual or extra copies of your insurance documents

Plan accordingly for the needs of family and pets

## Hurricane Season 2022 SBA - Let's Get Storm Ready

Assess your risk – A back to business self-assessment can help you assess your risk following disasters

**Create a plan** – Information at ready.gov/business can help you develop a plan, turn off all non-critical devices, and back up data

Execute your plan - Practice and review the plan with staff

Survey all damage following the storm and leave repairs to licensed contractors

Submit insurance claims as soon as possible

Apply for a low-interest SBA loan -- the first step to determine eligibility for the Public Assistance Program
