A BILL

To direct the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to continue to obligate and disburse covered funds in the Disaster Relief Fund during a lapse in appropriations, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Emergency
- 5 Management Continuity Act of 2025".

1	SEC. 2. CONTINUITY OF OPERATIONS OF FEMA.
2	(a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
3	sion of law, during a lapse in appropriations to the Federal
4	Emergency Management Agency, the Administrator of the
5	Agency shall continue obligating and disbursing covered
6	funds available in the Disaster Relief Fund for covered
7	programs.
8	(b) Employees.—Employees necessary to carry out
9	disbursements or related program activities under sub-
10	section (a) shall be treated as excepted employees under
11	section 1341 of title 31, United States Code (commonly
12	referred to as the 'Anti-Deficiency Act') and such employ-
13	ees may not be subject to furlough or reduction in force
14	due to the applicable lapse in appropriations.
15	(c) Definitions.—In this section:
16	(1) COVERED FUNDS.—The term "covered
17	funds" means any funds in the Disaster Relief Fund
18	that have been appropriated before the applicable
19	lapse in appropriation and remain available to be ex-
20	pended.
21	(2) COVERED PROGRAMS.—The term "covered
22	program" means any disaster relief, emergency as-
23	sistance, and recovery program authorized under the
24	Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency
25	Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.), including
