Federal engagement should strengthen that progress, not disrupt it. I stand ready to work alongside federal partners to identify initiatives that support both safety and civil rights.

To ensure that this operation is conducted lawfully, transparently, and with full respect for the people of New Orleans, I urge you to incorporate into your plan of action the recommendations of our local elected officials regarding transparency and public reporting, due process protections, identifiable federal agents, safeguards against discriminatory enforcement, and humanitarian protections. These measures are consistent with federal standards and reflect the values of our city and our nation.

New Orleans welcomes lawful and effective partnerships with federal agencies. What we cannot accept are operations that generate fear, undermine trust, or disregard constitutional protections. I respectfully request your prompt attention to these concerns and your commitment

to ensuring that Operation Catahoula Crunch proceeds in a manner worthy of the people of New Orleans.
