**A BILL**

To establish in the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency of the Department of Homeland Security a task force on artificial intelligence, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “CISA Securing AI  
5 Task Force Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. TASK FORCE ON SECURING ARTIFICIAL INTEL-**  
2 **LIGENCE.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the  
4 date of enactment of this Act, the Director of the Cyberse-  
5 curity and Infrastructure Security Agency of the Depart-  
6 ment of Homeland Security shall establish within the  
7 Agency a Task Force comprised of personnel from across  
8 its offices and divisions to coordinate the execution of di-  
9 rectives pursuant to Executive Order 14110, or a subse-  
10 quent Executive order, future Agency activities related to  
11 the safety and security of artificial intelligence, and the  
12 Agency’s contributions to Department-wide initiatives re-  
13 lated to the safety and security of artificial intelligence.  
14 Such Task Force shall—

15 (1) ensure coordination, cohesion, and align-  
16 ment of Agency efforts to improve the safe and se-  
17 cure design, development, adoption, and deployment  
18 of artificial intelligence;

19 (2) ensure coordination, cohesion, and align-  
20 ment of Agency input into Department-led, inter-  
21 agency, and nongovernment working groups or col-  
22 laborations related to artificial intelligence;

23 (3) assess and evaluate relevant Agency safety  
24 and security initiatives, guidance, and programs to  
25 ensure the unique safety and security challenges re-  
26 lated to artificial intelligence are contemplated and

1 addressed and recommend updates to such initia-  
2 tives, guidance, and programs, as appropriate;

3 (4) ensure the full expertise from across the  
4 Agency is leveraged to identify how artificial intel-  
5 ligence can be used to defend against traditional and  
6 emerging cyber threats;

7 (5) ensure coordination of Agency efforts to ad-  
8 vise stakeholders of potential cyber risks associated  
9 with the deployment of artificial intelligence-based  
10 software;

11 (6) identify artificial intelligence workforce gaps  
12 at the Agency and ways to address them;

13 (7) coordinate the Agency's efforts to promote  
14 the adoption of secure artificial intelligence-based  
15 software;

16 (8) recommend to the Director new Agency ini-  
17 tiatives to improve the safe and secure design, devel-  
18 opment, adoption, and deployment of artificial intel-  
19 ligence;

20 (9) ensure the Agency's efforts related to artifi-  
21 cial intelligence meet appropriate privacy, civil  
22 rights, and civil liberties standards; and

23 (10) support the publication of the Agency's ar-  
24 tificial intelligence use inventory, including devel-  
25 oping processes to ensure the accuracy of artificial

1 intelligence inventory submissions and the reliability  
2 of data used in artificial intelligence systems used by  
3 the Agency.

4 (b) BIENNIAL BRIEFINGS.—Not later than 6 months  
5 after the date of the establishment of the Task Force  
6 under subsection (a), and every 6 months thereafter until  
7 such time as this Act ceases to be in effect in accordance  
8 with subsection (c), the Task Force shall report to the  
9 Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Rep-  
10 resentatives and the Committee on Homeland Security  
11 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate on the activities  
12 of such Task Force during the preceding 6-month period.

13 (c) SUNSET.—This Act shall cease to be in effect on  
14 the date that is 5 years after the date of the enactment  
15 of this Act.
